### CEO Resigna After Nine Years' Service

It was with some sadness that I tendered my resignation due to family reasons to Council at their May Ordinary Meeting. After a combined 14 years here in Laverton (1995-2000 and then again from 2008 until now), it will be difficult to say goodbye when I finish on 11 August 2017.

The President has released a Media Statement which is reproduced in this edition of 'The Sturt Pea'. I sincerely thank the President for his kind words and wish the Shire and everyone here all the very best for an exciting future. I look forward to visiting in the future to see the changes following completion of the Main Street and Laverton Community Hub Projects.

### Vacancy on Council to be Held Over

Following the April Ordinary Meeting of Council, Geoff Walder resigned as a Councillor due to his pending relocation to New South Wales. As a result of Geoff's resignation, a vacancy was created on Council for a Councillor for the balance of Geoff's term which ends in October 2017. Council considered this at the May Ordinary Meeting and resolved to seek the approval of the Electoral Commission to hold this vacancy over until the October Council elections. This request was made, as the election process would only allow a newly elected Councillor two months in office before their position became vacant again and would need to be recontested at the October elections.

Council has recently received the approval of the Electoral Commission to hold the vacancy over until the October Ordinary Council Elections. The result of this is that Council will function with 6 elected members (Councillors) until October 2017.

### **Annual Meeting of Electors**

An Annual Meeting of Electors has been set by Council to be held at 4:00pm in the Council Chambers at the Shire Administration Office on Thursday 22 June 2017. This will be followed by the June Ordinary Meeting of Council. Matters to be considered at the Annual Meeting of Electors are the presentation of the 2014/15 Annual Report, comprising the Auditor's Report, Financial Report and message from the President. The President will also consider any other items of business at his discretion.



### Main Street Project Update

Residents will have been watching with interest the works as they have been occurring in Augusta Street. Works are progressing as planned, however the contractors have been experiencing some unforeseen challenges with buried services in locations not identified on any plans or through "Dial Before You Dig". These will ultimately result in contract variations, but necessary for a successful outcome.

The pavers have now been ordered. There will be just over 7,300 square metres of paving installed for this project. Plans of the paving, including samples of the pavers, are available for inspection at the Shire Office.

Also ordered are the various items of 'street furniture' including a large rotunda, several shade shelters and a number of bench seats/tables, rubbish bins and bollards.

### **Laverton Community Hub Project**

Until recently, this project had been progressing well. Unfortunately the Shire has received advice that this project, as well as the new Laverton Hospital, are being reviewed by the new Labor State Government. This is most disappointing as planning is well under way for both projects. Nevertheless, the Shire is now committed to completing the detailed architectural drawings, plans and specifications and these should be finalised in the coming weeks.

Until the Royalties for Regions funds are confirmed by the State Government, this project may need to be put on 'hold'. The President, Cr Pat Hill, is endeavouring to arrange a meeting with the Minister for Regional Development, Alannah McTiernan, as soon as possible to put a strong case to the Minister that both projects are vital for Laverton's future.

Let's hope Pat's meeting with the Minister goes ahead and has a positive outcome.

"Steve will be here until 11 August 2017, and will work closely with Council to ensure a smooth transition once a new CEO has been appointed after a thorough recruitment process" added Cr Hill.

"On behalf of the Council of the Shire of Laverton I sincerely thank Steve for his service to the Shire and wish him and his family all the very best for the future" concluded Cr Hill.










### National Simultan **Storytime!**





### From the Constabulary First Class Constable Callan Breen

Hello and welcome to another issue of the Sturt Pea. Today's issue continues in trend with our previous issues coming from the Constables of Laverton Police Station.

I have now been at Laverton for about 15 months, along with my partner First Class Constable Tahlia. If you have not met me yet, I am commonly described as the "copper with all the tattoos." Tahlia and I came to Laverton seeking adventure and something out of the ordinary, with a real bush experience.

I was born and bred in Perth, growing up south of the river, naturally making me a Dockers fan. Before coming to Laverton I have worked predominantly at Fremantle Police Station and Cockburn Police Station.

Tahlia is originally from Sydney moving to Perth when she was young. I have slowly managed to convert her from Sydney Swans to the Dockers. She has worked at Fremantle, Cockburn and Kwinana Police Station's.

Laverton has not disappointed with being given opportunities to work in all facets of Policing, across the vast area our Police Station covers. Laverton Police Station covers 187,000 square kilometres of land which can certainly be a challenge in itself.

We have both been given opportunities to experience the Ngaanyatjarra Lands (NG) relieving in the small Multi-Function Police Facilities. I was fortunate enough last year to relieve in Warakurna, travelling to almost all of the NG communities, including trips to Bungle Biddy (I hope I'm spelling that right), Sandy Blight Track, Olgas and Uluru. Here are some photo's I managed to snap along the way.



### Police report





If I am perfectly honest I am not sure I would have ever made my way out here and gotten to experience the wonderful countryside if we had not made the move. I am very glad to have made that decision and our experience will provide great stories for the rest of our lives.

In more local news Laverton Police continue to work hard, often behind the scenes and unheard. Over the last few months there has been a notable increase of Volatile Substance Abuse (VSU). For the unaware, meaning people "sniffing" or "huffing" substances such as paint, petrol and glue.

VSU is very concerning behaviour which poses serious and significant health risks to those who abuse them. We are working hard in collaboration with other agencies, such as Department of Child Protection (DCP) and HOPE to address the issue. The biggest thing that you can do to help as general public include ensuring all substances are safely secured. Paint items are the biggest item of abuse and often the cause and target of many of our burglary and stealing offences.

First Class Constable Brett MURDOCK has some education material he will be dispersing to the community shortly.

Most of you are aware that Senior Sergeant Heath SOUTAR will be leaving us shortly, making his way to Collie. On behalf of Laverton Police Station we wish him the best of luck and hope he has enjoyed his time here. Although I wasn't here from the start of his time here, it is obvious the significant impact he has had on the station's team and performance, pushing it towards one of the best in the Goldfields District.

### Big numbers of first-time prospectors spark safety call

A cooler than usual summer has created an early start to Western Australia's prospecting season and a record number of treasure hunters in the field, prompting a safety warning from the Department of Mines and Petroleum (DMP).

"We usually run a safety campaign at this time of year, but this year we really need to get our message out there to what appears to be record number of first-time prospectors." DMP Executive Director Dr Ivor Roberts said.

"Prospecting is fun for young and old, but people need to be aware of the dangers that claimed the life of a prospector only a few years ago."

Dr Roberts said that nearly 1000 Miner's Rights had been issued since the start of the year, with almost 600 issued since 1 March.

"That means a lot of first-time prospectors will be heading out into regional WA and exposing themselves to the dangers of going bush," he said.

"We are to telling people to obey what we call the Seven Golden Rules for prospecting and the number one rule is to put safety first.

"The department is also encouraging prospectors to carry Personal Locator Beacons (PLBs) when prospecting in remote areas."

The device, which can be purchased from most outdoor stores, is considered by search and rescue organisations to be ideal for use in remote areas as it does not rely on telecommunication networks to submit a signal.

"PLBs are the best way of avoiding the sometimes tragic results of getting lost in the Goldfields and the outback," Dr Roberts said.

"If you're not carrying a beacon, you're not taking enough responsibility for your life and it doesn't matter how much gold you find, if you get lost, you risk losing your life."

The Seven Golden Rules for prospecting campaign will target tourist bureaus, libraries, caravan parks and DMP offices with posters, brochures and booklets.

### Fact file:

- A Miner's Right is the most common prospecting permit used by tourists visiting Western Australia and allows holders to prospect on Crown Land with hand-held tools, such as a metal detector, and to take and keep samples or specimens up to 20 kilograms.
- The first Seven Golden Rules prospecting campaign in 2014 was in response to a recommendation by the State Coroner for prospectors to carry a Personal Locator Beacon (PLBs) following the death of a prospector.
- In 2012, lost prospector Michael Graham sparked a 15-day search involving aircraft, motorbikes, horses and expert trackers covering 1500 square kilometres. The body of the 46-year-old father-of-two was never found.
- The Coroner's Court was told that of the nine prospectors who had been reported missing that year, only one had been carrying a PLB and was found within four hours.
- Searches for missing prospectors average 11.3 hours but many last one or two days, while aircraft searches cost up to \$5000 per hour

### The Seven Golden Rules of Prospecting

### 1. Put safety first

- Make sure you have enough water, fuel, maps, first aid supplies.
- Give serious consideration to taking some form of telecommunications and a global positioning system to fix locations, and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB) – it may turn out to be your most important safety device.

### 2. Obtain a Miner's Right permit

when prospecting on vacant Crown land (\$25 from any Mining Registrar's office).

### 3. Obtain a 40E permit

before prospecting within an exploration tenement (if you don't have written permission from the tenement holder),

### 4. Get written permission

from the tenement holder when prospecting on:

- · a mining lease
- an exploration licence (if you don't have a 40E permit)
- · a prospecting licence

And you all thought Laverton was a quiet sedate little town



Pro Tip: Make sure to squeeze the beauty blender underneath cold water before use and it should almost triple in size giving you a flawless finish to your makeup look.



I personally use this product over top of an eyebrow powder or pencil to set the hairs in place and keeping a natural look to them. This product retails for \$5 - \$10 and for that price you may as well give it a go to see if it wins you over like it has done for me.

#### Dog Registration:

#### Why should I register my dog?





Registering your pet is a legal requirement under the state legislation. If your cat or dog is not registered, you can get a fine of up to \$200.

# To register your dog, you can go to the Shire Office which is located on 9 Macpherson Place.

When you register your pet, you not only have it down on the shires computer system but if anything happens to your dog (goes missing, or runs away) it will be easier to identify and track down. If it gets taken to the pound as a lost dog registered pets get higher priority over non registered ones, so it is less likely to be euthanized. It is important to register your dog as it is a part of the law. There will also be penalties if it is caught without being registered. If you have not registered your dog yet then you should get to it today!

Please note: If your dog is not micro-chipped you are not able to register it. For not only the safety of your dog, but the community's guidelines, you should get your dog micro chipped as soon as possible so it is able to be registered.

Wild Rabbits:

Did you know?

Baby rabbits are called kits



#### Why should they not be removed from their Burrow?

Fewer than 10% of orphaned rabbits survive each week. Removing Wild Rabbits from their burrows is not only harmful to them, but also illegal in some places and totally unnecessary unless they are sick or injured.

Many rabbits have been taken from their homes/burrows recently around the Easter period. This is not ok. Most rabbits that were removed were so young that their eyes weren't even open. This means they were around 5-7 days old. They are not supposed to be used as toys or given as presents. They belong in their burrows with their mother who can fully support and nurture them until they are able to look after themselves. Despite peoples best attempts at looking after these bunnies, many ended up passing away. Substitute milk has barely any of the nutrients that the mother's milk provides to them and second hand care unfortunately is not enough to help save them. Unless the bunnies are sick, or the mother is injured please do not remove them from their burrows.

#### What should I do if I find or are given a baby Wild Rabbit?

If you ever find or are given a Wild Rabbit, especially a baby, Please try to place it back in its burrow, if this is not possible the best option is to give the Kit to a qualified Wildlife Carer. DO NOT take it home as a pet. If you want a pet rabbit PLEASE adopt a domestic breed.

Wild rabbits are not meant to be house pets and more than 90% end up dying within days or weeks after being kept in captivity. Not only can wild rabbits contract or give diseases to family members and other pets in the house hold, they are often frightened towards humans and as a result suffer from serious amounts of stress and shock. Indoors/captivity is a major difference to their usual home!!!!!

Please think twice before you remove and take a bunny away from not only its main source of living (mother's milk), but its

comfort and warmth as well. Not only is it an illegal act in some places, but it is cruel to not only the baby rabbit itself, but to its family who will be stressed out wondering what happened to it.











# Self-Watering Planter Pot



## Made from Recycled Plastic Bottles

The plastic bottle is one thing we are always putting in the bin and constantly finding on the ground wherever we go. So why not collect some and make a simple self-watering planter pot for some of your favourite herbs or flowers.

Simply select the bottle you are wanting to use (preferable a 2 litre bottle, as this will have the best results for growing your desired plant), and just follow this simple step by step guide:

#### Tools needed:

- Stanley knife
- Scissors
- Marker pen

- Cotton string
- Plastic Bottle

#### Step 1

Peel the label off the plastic bottle. If there is any dry glue from the label on the bottle you can either leave it on the bottle or try removing it with a cloth and some Teatree oil.

Step 2



Mark a line to follow when cutting the bottle in half. A Rough guide to help keep the line straight is to sit your bottle on a flat surface and get a can out of your pantry.

Hold your marker on top of the can and rotate the bottle to make a perfectly straight line to use as a guide

#### Step 3



Get your stanley knife and carefully poke some small holes about 2-3 cm apart from one another at the top base of the bottle. Take off the cap and poke a hole big enough to fit 2 bits of cotton string through it. (Note. you could also try poking the bottle with a metal skewer).

Once all holes are in the top base of the bottle, get your stanley knife and make an entry slit on the line you marked, in the previous step. Cut the rest of the line with scissors.



#### Step 4



As using the can was not an exact marker but a rough size for most 2 litre bottles, you may need to trim it to make them fit together correctly. The objective is to get the top of the bottle to sit just above the bottom as show in Fig 2.

If bottles need trimming, put your marker on a flat surface and rotate the bottle around, and then trim with your scissors.

Feed 2 lengths of cotton string (around 6cm long) through the hole in the cap of the bottle. The cotton should hang out enough so it can sit in the water. I found tying a knot in the in the centre of the cotton string helps the string to not fall out of the cap.



#### Step 6

Fill bottom half of the bottle with about 3 cm of water. Fill the top half of the bottle with soil. Make sure, as your putting in the soil that you pull the cotton string up so its not all left in the bottom.

#### Step 7

Your ready to plant!!!

Once seed or plant is planted drizzle the top of the soil with water then watch your plant grow over the weeks.

# Slow-cooked cheesy beef tortellini

## <u>Ingredients</u>

- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
- 1kg beef chuck steak, trimmed, cut into 2cm pieces
- 1 brown onion, finely chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 800g can diced tomatoes
- 500ml (2 cups) beef stock
- 2 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon caster sugar
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh continental parsley
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped fresh basil
- 375g pkt veal tortellini
- 100g feta, crumbled
- 100g (1 cup) coarsely grated mozzarella



#### <u>Metho</u>d

- 1. Heat the oil in a large flameproof casserole dish over medium heat. Cook the beef, in 3 batches, turning, for 5 minutes or until browned. Transfer to a bowl. Add the onion and garlic to the dish. Cook, stirring, for 3 minutes or until softened. Add the tomato, stock, paste, sugar and beef to the casserole dish.
- 2. Bring to the boil. Reduce heat to low. Simmer, covered, stirring occasionally, for 1 hour 30 minutes or until beef is tender. Cook, uncovered, for 20-25 minutes or until sauce thickens slightly. Remove from heat. Stir in the parsley and basil. Season.
- Meanwhile, preheat oven to 200C/180C fan forced. Cook the tortellini in a large saucepan of salted boiling water until just al dente.
   Drain. Return to saucepan. Add 1 cup beef mixture. Gently stir to combine.
- 4. Spread the tortellini mixture over the beef. Sprinkle with the cheeses. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until the cheese is golden and melted.



# Mixed apple & berry sponge pudding



#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 160C. Place the apple, juice and 1 cup (220g) sugar in a small pan and cook over low heat, stirring, for 3 minutes or until the sugar dissolves. Cook for a further 3-4 minutes, stirring occasionally, until apple softens slightly. Cool, then stir through berries. Transfer to a 1.25 litre baking dish. Set aside.
- 2. Whisk eggs, milk, whisky, lemon zest and vanilla in a bowl until combined. Set aside. Place fl our, baking powder and remaining sugar in a bowl. Pour egg mixture into dry ingredients, whisking well to form a smooth batter. Pour over fruit, then bake for 30-35 minutes until golden and firm to the touch.
- 3. Dust with icing sugar and serve warm with cinnamon cream.




