

Staff Updates

Ron Scantlebury will commence on 1 March 2018 in the position of Executive Manager Corporate & Community Services on a six month contractual arrangement. Ron brings a wealth of experience having previously worked in similar positions at the former Town of Northam, Shire of Esperance and Shire of Harvey.

Congratulations to CRC Trainee, Jezaire Kelly, for successfully completing her traineeship. Jezaire's dedication and commitment to her studies and position meant she completed all requirements of the Certificate 3 of Business a month early. Jezaire will continue her career with the Shire of Laverton as she commences a new position with the Community Resource Centre in early April.

Aaliyah Tuhakaraina has tendered her resignation. We thank Aaliyah for her efforts whilst working at the Shire Administration Office and the Community Resource Centre and wish her well in her future endeavours.

Laverton Hospital Upgrade and Laverton Community Hub Projects

As previously advised, in May 2015, Terry Redmond (the then Minister for Regional Development), announced funding of \$19.5M through the Royalties for Regions (R4R) program to fund the development of a new Hospital in Laverton. In June 2016 Council entered into a Financial Assistance Agreement with the State Government for an amount of \$8M from the Royalties for Regions (R4R) program for the Laverton Community Hub project.

Subsequent to the change of State Government in Western Australia in March 2017, the new State Government withdrew funding from many of the previously R4R grant funded projects due to the State's economy being in a worse position than was previously known, and unfortunately this included withdrawal of the \$19.5M previously allocated for the Laverton Hospital Upgrade.

Following a visit to Laverton on 13 December 2017, by the Deputy Premier, Hon Roger Cook MLA, the Minister for Health, Hon Alannah MacTiernan MLC, the Minister for Regional Development, and the Member for Mining and Pastoral



Region, Hon Kyle McGinn MLC, Council has received correspondence from the State Government proposing that \$4M of the \$8M funding originally allocated under the R4R program for the Laverton Community Hub project be redirected and reallocated towards the development of a new Hospital in Laverton.



Once the Minister's letter was received, the Shire President, Deputy President and the Chief Executive Officer had discussions with the Minister's Advisory Officer, Mr Cole Thurley, and with representatives of the Goldfields Esperance Development Commission on the future of the Community Hub Project.

The discussions were quite positive in that if Council is supportive of the Ministers' proposal, then the Development Commission and Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) have given an undertaking to assist in whatever capacity they can to progress the Hub project as a staged process and with future grant applications to enable the future stages as Council endeavours to commit.

At the present time there is funding available for the Hub project totalling \$5,928,272. Council has proposed that this funding be utilised for a Stage 1 of the Hub project incorporating upgrade of the Aquatic Centre (pool and new buildings), and for renovations/improvement works at the Community Hall. We are currently in discussions with the DPIRD finalising a variation to the original grant agreement. In addition the architects are finalising amended plans for Council approval and then we can go to tender.

Aged Accommodation Project

Unfortunately the provision of Aged Accommodation in the Hospital upgrade has had to take a backseat in the initial stages of the aforementioned negotiations, however the Minister has directed Goldfields Esperance Development Commission staff to assist Council in seeking funding opportunities for this project and we have begun working on a business plan which hopefully will result in a positive outcome.

Main Street Project

We are pleased to advise that whilst it has taken somewhat longer than was ever anticipated, this project has now been completed. The new town entry statements and main street upgrades provide a fresh approach into the Laverton townsite and we have received a number of extremely positive comments from visitors.



STERILI SATI ON

Sterilisation is a growing concern in and throughout the world, with animal shelters becoming so full they are not able to accept animals. In Australia alone, the RSPCA received around 137,000 animals nationwide throughout the 2016- 2017 financial year. This has risen from the 2012-2013 financial year by 9,100 animals in difference. Sterilisation is an important part of owning your animals, many benefits come with sterilising your pet including health benefits, registration benefits and it also keeps down the numbers of pets that are being given to the RSPCA each year.

1: Most animals in the animal shelters are due to unwanted litters, from pets that haven't been sterilised. The most common reasons for abandoning animals is because of boredom, inability to afford vet bills, vaccinations, food or other treatments such as worming.

2: For the 2016-2017 financial year alone, approximately 20,326 animals from the RSPCA were euthanized, due to behavioural problems, medical problems and other reasons that could have simply been avoided if their parents were sterilised. 5,763 of these were dogs, and 14,563 were cats. 1,734 of these were other animals, such as livestock and wildlife.

3: Every litter born in your home adds to the problem by stopping a rescue being adopted. There are no guarantees that the animals in the litter wont be abused or fall back into the rescue system - this adds pressure to not only yourself, trying to find suitable owners but also the rescue centre who often have to put down animals because of this.



4: Un-sterilised males can become aggressive and will often wander in search of females, which can then result in fights and other females contracting FIV, Sepsis and other diseases which can be life threatening to your pets.

5: Registration of your animals is cheaper. This is a win/win as sterilising your animal not only improves their health but to register your pet is a legal requirement and compulsory by law. (See Below - as per the Shire of Laverton's schedule of fees and charges).

Think of the colour that you want to correct (purple under eye circles, for example) and then look for the shade positioned directly across from it on the colour wheel—that's the one you should go for. Keep in mind that lighter shades work best on fair skin, while deeper shades are the perfect match for darker skin tones. (Refer to the photo on the next page for a good guide on which colours do what).

HOW CAN I INCORPORATE IT INTO MY ROUTINE?

I recommend you apply a correcting concealer (LA Girl Pro Concealers are a personal favourite) or a correcting primer (Stila One Step Correcting Primer is my go to) underneath your everyday foundation and concealer by using your fingertips to apply a tiny amount of product only on those spots that require extra TLC. Next, apply your go-to foundation or BB cream with a brush or a beauty blender and, as a last step, apply a sheer concealer. To lock your makeup down you can set your face with a powder but that is optional.









Laverton Library News

For the last month staff within the Laverton Library have been busy setting up some new and exciting services for the community of Laverton to take advantage of. Laverton Library now has a range of eResource apps for you to download onto your phone.

What is an eResource?

eResources is a new way that you can read, and listen to books using technology such as a phone, tablet or computer. The apps consists of books, magazines, movies and **documentaries. And the best news... It's FREE!**

How it works?

To be able to use this service you will need to firstly visit the Laverton Library, located in the Community Resource Centre and make sure to bring your desired device with you. Using your library membership details a Library officer will assist you in downloading the app/s onto your device-**if you don't have a Library membership a Library Officer will sign you up.** Once the download is complete you are ready to start borrowing online.

Much like a Library, you have a set amount of days (7, 12, 21 days) to read, watch or listen to the borrowed e-resource, once the allotted time is up the e-resource will automatically be removed from your device. You can also extend the borrowing time by renewing the e-resource before the allotted time is expired.

What apps are available?

Feel like watching something? Kanopy is a streaming service that has more than 26,000 films, ranging from documentaries, indie and foreign film, classics and blockbuster movies. You get borrow up to four movies per month.





Don't have Wi-fi?

That's alright, as a Library member - visit the Library and one of our friendly Library Officers will assist you in utilizing our Wi-fi in order to allow you to download an eResource.

In addition to eResources, Laverton Library has introduced a FREE public computer with the following 2 programs available:

1. Ancestry (library edition)

Ancestry provides the tools to track family history and has 1,000's of documents including voting records, birth, death and marriage records.

2. Storylines

Storylines is an online archive managed and hosted by the State Library of Western Australia, with advice and guidance provided by an Aboriginal Reference Group with ongoing state-wide consultation. It allows users from all around the state to engage with Aboriginal stories, language, perspectives and history.

The Storylines Database has more than 2,500 photographs from around the state, as well as a number of oral histories, family trees, historical documents and other media files. Items on Storylines are sorted by different criteria including people, places, collections and language groups. There are more than 3,800 people identified in the system.

Visit the Laverton Library and a Library Officer will be happy to assist familiarising you with the programs.





Ingredients:

- 1 red capsicum, thinly sliced
- 4 carrots, peeled into ribbons
- 3 teaspoons ground coriander
- 100g haloumi, thinly sliced
- 1 teaspoon grated lime rind
- 1/2 cup shredded iceberg lettuce
- 1 lime, cut into wedges, to serve
- Preheat oven to 200C/180C fan-forced. Line a large baking tray with baking paper. Place capsicum, onion and carrot on prepared tray. Drizzle with 1 tablespoon oil. Sprinkle with 2 teaspoons ground coriander. Toss to coat. Bake for 20 minutes or until golden and tender.
