Budget 2018/2019

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

I am pleased to present to you the Shire's 2018/19 Budget, which marks the start of yet another exciting period for Laverton and the continuation of projects for the community. This year, the sixth under the Integrated Strategic Planning (ISP) Framework, is as a result of a major review as required by legislation, of the Shire's Strategic Community Plan, Corporate Business Plan and Long Term Financial Plan.

The Shire's regular approach of preparing a balanced budget is again a hall mark for the 2018/19 financial year. Funding to achieve a balanced budget across both operating and capital expenditure comes from a variety of sources including grants, loans, and reserve fund monies and of course property rates.

The Council has kept the rates to a minimum increase to ensure that the commitments to the community through the strategic planning mechanisms can be met and enhanced. The council is mindful of the capacity of people to meet their commitments as the council meets its own for the community.

The minimum rates have been increased by \$10 from \$294 to \$304 per assessment with an overall rate increase of 3.5% across the board and further adjusted by increase and decreases in the valuation of properties. The Council advertised the differential rates in June/July 2018 and in the wash up, council did not receive any submissions. Whether this is correct or incorrect, the Council has made decisions to move forward with the proposed differential rates and at the end of the year it would be pleasing to report of the meeting of these commitments and reporting back to the community.

The rubbish collection service fee has been increased to \$304 per service which covers the collection costs but not the management of the waste disposal facility.

The following are notable features of the 2018/19 budget:

- Laverton Community Hub has commenced and will be completed in this financial year. The old swimming pool has been removed and awaiting the commencement of groundworks and construction. Works have commenced on refurbishment of the community hall.
- Council has made a contribution to the Men's Shed, much needed within the town.
- Laverton Cemetery with the installation of seating, carpark and shade shelters.

- Proposal for Mt Weld Road to be sealed approx. 24 km with assistance from the mining companies (still being negotiated) with a contribution of \$1.4 million to secure the project with an overall cost of \$4.8 million
- Great Central Road, the council has received funding to seal another 50 km which in time will bring additional economic benefits to Laverton as the traffic increases. The financial contribution from Main Roads is \$36.5 million and Shire of Ngaanyatjaraku is \$4.0 million
- The Council continues with flood damage works on several roads with approx. \$10 million of works outstanding.
- Support of festivals and activities within the Shire such as Australia Day, Anzac Day etc.
- Enhancements to the Great Beyond and the Explorers Hall of Fame
- The Council is involved in so many activities than even the Council finds it hard to keep up with them. Do you know that the Council provides financial support to the medical services within the town? Also the Council covered the cost of the upgrade to the SBS television reception within the town.



Pictures of Flood Damage and the impact on the road network

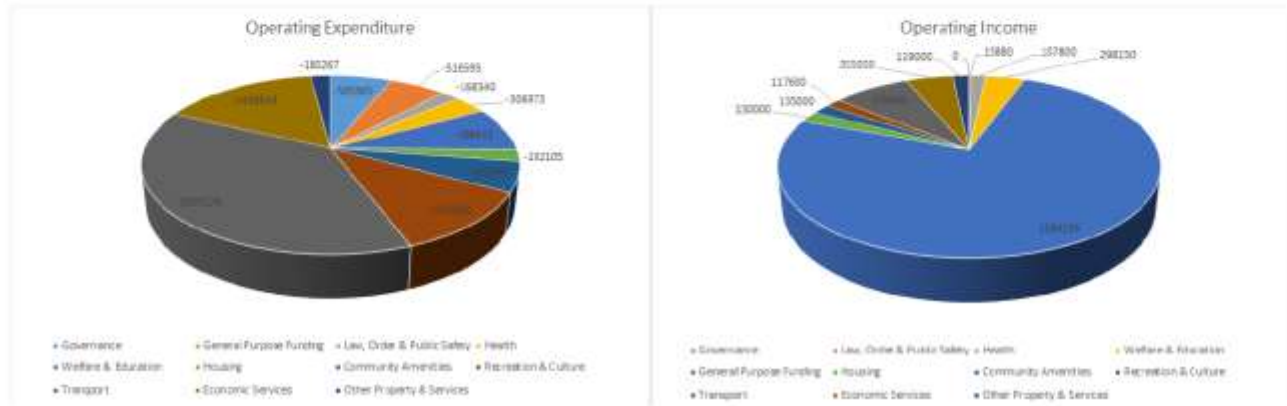

In conclusion, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of my fellow Council members who have contributed towards the formulation of the budget and to thank the CEO and his team for their involvement and compilation of the budget document.

Overall, I commend the 2018/19 budget to you and look forward to the projects, programs, facilities and services detailed within it being delivered to the ratepayers and residents of the Shire of Laverton.

Laverton Community Hub Projects

Contractors are on-site and work on the new pool and community hall has commenced in earnest.

Unfortunately it doesn't look as though we will have a pool for the forthcoming summer period and Council is looking at alternatives to provide some relief for the community over this period.

We will most probably take the community bus to Leonora one day on weekends, and we are also investigating the possible purchase of a heavy duty water slide for use on the Town Oval with reticulation for 2 hours daily, from 3pm to 5pm.

We are open to other ideas / suggestions.

Technical Services

• Old Laverton Road – Update

Realignment work is completed and the floodway has been cement stabilised. Sealing of 300 hundred meters of the road from the end of bitumen across the first floodway is still to occur and this will be incorporated into the Great Central Project in late September.

• Bandya Road Culverts (SLK 46)

Three sets of culverts have been installed and approaches modified for sight distance. Signage and guideposts are on order and will be installed as soon as they arrive. We are also currently trying to source additional rock to install on some batters.

- **Laverton Airport**

The Laverton Airport Runway Lights have now been upgraded and are fully operational. Two additional toilets are also now functioning at the site after having the plumbing and power connected.

- **Shire Pathways**

Council adopted a 5 year Pathway Program and has recently made a grant application to construct a bitumen pathway on Weld Drive from the Caravan Park through to the Ambulance substation.

Administration

Our new computer software system went into operation, effective from 1 July 2018.

The 2018/2019 Rates Notices have been issued. If, for any reason, you have not received yours, please contact Nikki, our Rates Officer, at the Shire Administration Office. We are aware that with new computer systems things are prone to go wrong from time to time so whilst we have endeavoured for this to not happen, it is a possibility.

Staff Updates

Jeff Bennett has moved back to live on the coast and we wish him well. Tasharni Roe is now assisting Regina and Tanya in the CDC Office, helping people with any queries they have about the Cashless Debit Cards. We would like to welcome Darren Friend who joins us to continue the Synergy work where Cherie Delmage left off. We also have some other new starters to welcome – Geraldine Murphy who is a part-time Community Development Support Officer, Nathan Wasson who is helping out Andy Sutcliffe in the Depot Workshop for a while, and Jasmine Bonning who joins us as a casual cleaner. We hope you will all enjoy your time with the Shire.

Community Resource Centre funding to continue

- Following a review and consultation, Community Resource Centre funding will continue
- Community Resource Centre (CRC) funding will continue at the full \$13 million per year

The McGowan Government has listened to regional community concerns about the future of Community Resource Centres and will continue to fully fund each CRC.

Following extensive consultation and a review of the CRC program, the State Government has decided to continue to fund Community Resource Centres to the tune of \$13 million per year.

The review of the Community Resource Centre program did highlight some areas that could be improved.

The traineeship component of the CRC program will be strengthened to ensure Community Resource Centres are working with local businesses and local governments to get the best outcomes for their trainees, and will be made available to regional areas which do not have CRCs.

Auditing processes will be strengthened to ensure Community Resource Centres are delivering the best outcomes for their communities.

Comments attributed to Regional Development Minister Alannah MacTiernan:

"Our Government was forced to consider a number of Budget savings to help fix the financial mess left by the former Liberal National Government.

"After reviewing the Community Resource Centre program and listening to regional communities' concerns about the future of CRCs, it is clear CRC funding should continue.

"We will continue to fully fund CRCs to the tune of \$13 million per year, ensuring CRCs can deliver important services to regional communities.

"We want to see the CRC program strengthened, with a real focus on getting the most out of the traineeship program to drive training opportunities across regional WA."

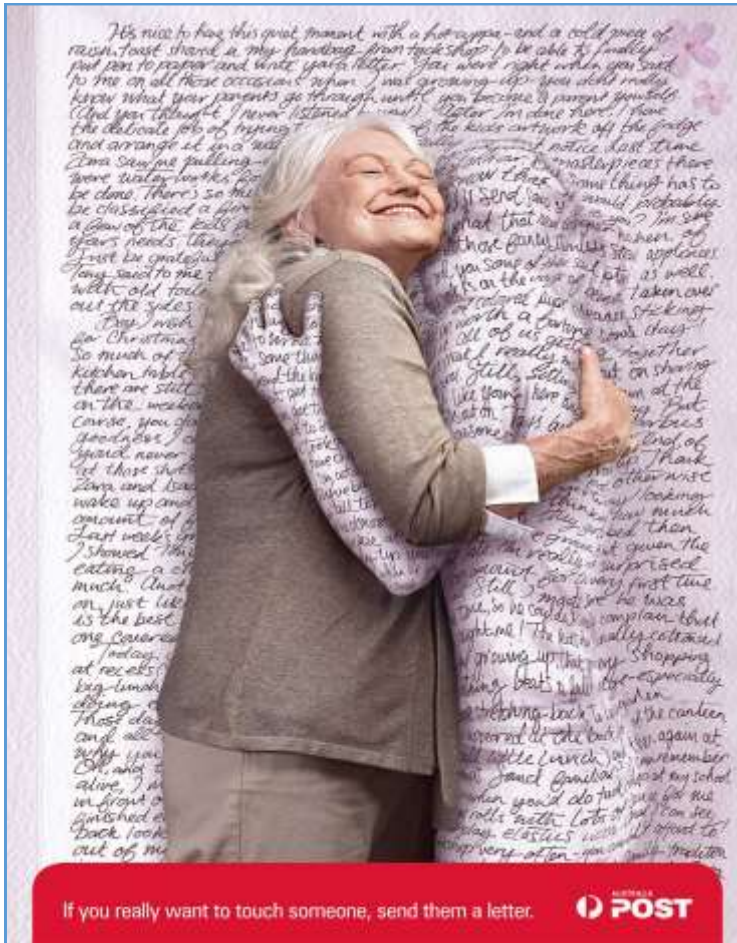

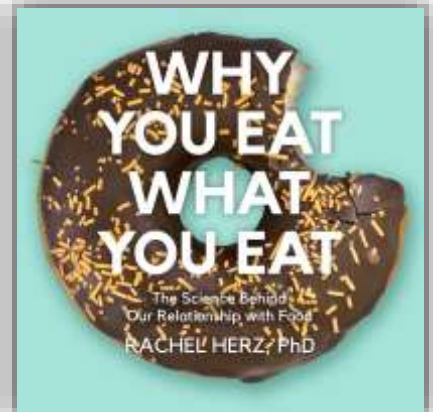

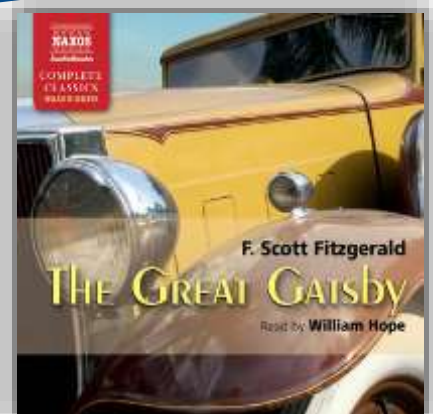

EVERYDAY FOODS THAT CAN HARM

Most of us already know that chocolate is bad for our furry friends but there are far more dangerous, everyday foods that we eat without even thinking about the hazards they present to our Dogs.

If you know or suspect your pet has eaten something that they shouldn't and are acting differently with some of these symptoms, it is very important that you call the vet immediately. They will give you advice on what to do until you are able to get help for them. Some of these foods can be extremely dangerous if ingested in high quantities, and even in low quantities for smaller dogs.

Other Toxic Food to Dogs;

- * Alcohol
- * Onions & Garlic
- * Coffee
- * Avocado
- * Nuts
- * Fruits with seeds/pits
- * Yeast Dough
- * Raisins & Currents
- * Mushrooms
- * Sugar
- * Paracetamol



Xylitol (Used as a substitute for sugar in human foods)

Lollies, Gum, Toothpaste, Protein Powders - these are just some things that are sweetened with Xylitol. Symptoms of Xylitol poisoning can result in vomiting, lethargy and coordination problems. Depending on how much your dog has ingested, Xylitol can also cause liver failure.

Macadamia Nuts

Just 6 raw macadamia nuts can cause fatalities in dogs. Macadamia poisoning can result in ataxia, vomiting, lethargy, weakness, muscle tremors and fever.

Chocolate

Chocolate contains theobromine which is found in cocoa, and is poisonous to dogs. The concentration of theobromine in chocolate changes within different types of chocolate. Cocoa powder and dark chocolate contain higher levels of theobromine than milk chocolate. White chocolate has little to no amount of theobromine, but should still not be fed to your dog.

Symptoms of theobromine poisoning include, Vomiting, Diarrhoea, hyperactivity, increased heart rate, restlessness and nervousness. In higher dose quantities, theobromine poisoning can be fatal.

Grapes and Raisins

Grapes are known to be toxic to some dogs and can cause kidney damage which can lead to kidney failure. The toxic agent in grapes is still to be identified and it is still under investigation as to why it affects some dogs and not others.

Symptoms of Grape Poisoning include: loss of appetite, lethargy, weakness, unusual quietness, oral ulcers, dehydration, tremors and in some extreme cases, seizures and coma.

Creamy fettuccine carbonara

At the end of the day, when you get home from work, sometimes you just **don't have the energy to cook dinner. This creamy fettuccine carbonara** takes 15 minutes to cook, meaning you can get dinner done and sit down to relax even sooner.

Ingredients:

- 375grms fettuccine pasta
- 20grms butter
- 175grms shortcut bacon rashers, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2 teaspoons fresh rosemary , finely chopped
- 2 eggs
- 2 egg yolks
- 1/2 cup light thickened cooking cream
- 1/3 cup parmesan finely grated

Method:

1. Cook pasta following packet directions.
2. Meanwhile, melt butter in a frying pan over medium heat.
3. Add bacon and cook for 4 minutes or until golden
4. Add garlic and rosemary, cook stirring for 1 minute or until fragrant.
5. Whisk eggs, yolks, cream and parmesan in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Drain pasta and return to saucepan.
6. Add egg mixture and bacon to pasta and cook, tossing over low heat for 1 minute or until sauce thickens and coats pasta.
7. Sit down and enjoy!













Nominations must be submitted on the official Nomination Forms which will be available from the Shire Office, the Great Beyond Visitor Centre and the Community Resource Centre.
