





To be eligible for free replacement shower head(s) under the program:

You must live in <u>one of the regional towns</u> listed under Regional Programs on Water Corporation's website If you are a tenant, you and the landlord must agree to participate in the Shower Swap Program, which includes the replacement of the old shower head/s with shower head/s provided under the Shower Head Swap Program.

The process:

You must take your old shower head/s to an exchange point identified on Water Corporation's website at watercorporation.com.au/community to exchange it for a new replacement shower head, whilst supplies last.

• A maximum of 2 old shower heads can be swapped for 2 replacement shower heads for each household, only while supplies last.

At the point in time that your old shower head is accepted by the exchange point, the old shower head becomes the property of the Water Corporation and cannot be returned to you.

You are responsible for:

Removal of the old shower head, including ensuring the removal of the old shower head is compatible with existing systems, the wall fitting(s) and plumbing. If you are in any doubt, we recommend that you <u>ask a licensed Waterwise Plumber</u> for advice.

• Installation of the replacement shower head, including ensuring the installation is compatible with existing systems, the wall fitting(s) and plumbing.

If you need assistance with installing the shower head/s, we recommend you contact a licensed Waterwise Plumber.

The condition, operation, maintenance, alteration, replacement, and/or removal of the replacement shower head.

Directing any product faults with your new shower head/s to the manufacturer Methven by directly calling 1300 638 483.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITIES Child Protection and Family Support

Laverton December 2018

It is now eighteen months since the Department of Communities was formed, bringing together Child Protection & Family Support; the Housing Authority; the Disability Services Commission; Youth Justice; Community Grants, Initiatives & Funding; and Regional Services Reform.

There is now improved communication and better and closer working between these organisations and this has helped in Laverton, for example, by making it easier for people to deal with the Housing Authority through the local office where a small supply of forms and information are now kept for day to day use.

There have been some changes in respect of Child Protection and Family Support across the Northern Goldfields, and now there are child protection workers in Laverton, Leonora, Warburton, Warakurna and Blackstone.

Kevin Morgan is now the Team Leader for the whole area and although he remains here in Laverton now he has to travel more widely every month.

As Kevin has stepped up into a different role, a new child protection worker will come to Laverton in January 2019.

In addition some new posts have been created for the area: four parttime remote community resource workers. These jobs will be for local people and will about offering more support to children and young people and families in the community.

Finally there is plan to develop a cadet scheme whereby young people can be recruited from school to be trained as the next generation of workers in the Department of Communities.

An exciting time ahead in 2019!

Quit for new life

Planning to have a baby or discovering you're pregnant can be one of the best moments in your life. This is the time to change to a healthier lifestyle for you and your family. Having a balanced diet, taking the right medication and participating in physical activity are some ways to get healthy. But the most important change you can make for yourself and your family is monitoring your use of tobacco smoking and exposure to second-hand smoke.

According to the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW), around 12% of women smoked at some time during their pregnancy. The smoking rates were higher among younger mothers (34%) and Aboriginal women (47%).

Smoking during pregnancy is harmful to the health of both the mother and the unborn child. Cigarette smoke contains more than 7000 chemicals, including lead, nicotine, cyanide, cadmium, mercury, carbon monoxide and tar. Around 70 of these chemicals are known to cause cancer. These chemicals travel to the unborn baby through absorption into the mother's blood and disturbs the supply of essential nutrients to both the mother and baby, increasing the risk of potential health problems. Carbon monoxide reduces oxygen supply leading to poor development of baby. In fact, smoking during pregnancy can lead to just some of these problems:

Lower birth weight (underdeveloped organs including lungs, heart and brain);

Premature birth (being born too early);

Miscarriage;

Stillbirth (baby is not alive when born);

Increased risk of SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome); and

Babies are at higher risk of getting asthma, high blood pressure and diabetes.

These complications can also develop if pregnant women and newborn babies are exposed to passive (second-hand) smoking. Smoking after pregnancy can also harm a baby as these chemicals easily transfer through breast milk.

Stopping smoking is the best thing you can do for yourself and your baby. It is financially rewarding and socially acceptable too. It can be difficult for some people to quit, and especially hard while pregnant, but having strong motivation and determination will benefit you, your baby and your entire family.

Some practical steps to take if you are regularly exposed to smokers and to protect your family from passive smoking include:

Wherever possible, move away from people who are smoking, or stay in non-smoking areas;

Make your home and car smoke-free; and

Put up 'No Smoking' signs around the house.

Talk to your doctor, midwife or health practitioner for more information and support. Call Quitline on 13 78 48 for a free professional and confidential counselling service. 



HOLIDAYS


Holiday season is just around the corner, and since it is such a hectic time of year, we sometimes can forget the stress it may put on our furry friends, before you make any plans to go away, please don't forget to make arrangements for your pets first.

Ways to keep your pets relaxed over the holiday period:

- Guests Provide guidelines to all Guests including Children about your pets behaviours and preferences - whether they are good with strangers or not, get anxious with noise etc. Provide your pets with a safe space to relax away from the hype. This can be a spare room, the garage or a kennel with some familiar toys / a blanket they like etc.
- Food Christmas food is one of the best things about Christmas but not for your furry friends!
 Human foods such as grapes, chocolate, cooked chicken bones and puddings can be very harmful to your pets so please make sure guests don't feed your pets and scraps are kept out of the way.
- Comings and Goings of Guests- If your pet is outside and there are people constantly fluctuating from within your property - especially if there is a gate or a door, make sure they are shutting it whenever they are leaving or arriving.
- Fireworks Over the New Year there tends to be firework displays all around - especially in the city. If your pet is unfamiliar to this please ensure they are inside and in an environment they feel comfortable and safe as many animals react fearfully to the noise and will take flight as a coping mechanism.
- Registrations and Micro-Chipping- Make sure all registrations and micro chipping is up to date! The holidays are a busy time of year and if the unfortunate happens and your pet goes missing, up to date registration and micro-chips will assist in you being reunited with your pet faster. Placing an ID tag on your pets collar with a contact name and number would also be a useful precaution.



According to the RSPCA - Reports of abandoned animals increased from 88 to 117 in November 2016. This increased further in January 2017 to 127. The majority of animals abandoned over Christmas are cats and dogs who are left at home while their owners go on holiday.

If you are thinking of going on holiday please do not forget about your pet! Abandoning an animal is an offence under the animal welfare act, which carries a maximum penalty of a 50,000 fine or five years in jail.

There are many options to ensure your pet will be safe while you are on holiday:

- House Sitter: You could ask a trusted friend or family member to look after your house while you are away, this can ensure that your pet will be in the comfort of its own home, around someone that they know and are comfortable with. If your family and friends are away too - there are websites online where you can find a reliable house sitter.
- Kennels: Although putting your pet into the Kennels while you go away can be expensive they will be looked after, fed and will be able to socialise with other animals.
- Pet friendly accommodation: Why not take your pet with you? Pet friendly accommodation is becoming more and more popular.

Method:

- 1. Boil the jug and then pour the boiling water into a large bowl and add the tea bags. Allow to sit for 5 minutes after giving it a stir.
- 2. Remove the tea bags and add the mixed dry fruit. Stir through the tea and leave to sit for 1 hour to soften.
- 3. Add the self raising flour to the bowl and mix to combine. Pour into a lined 20cm spring form cake tin and place into a 150° oven for 1 1/2 hours or until it bounces back when touched. Remove from the oven and allow to cool completely before wrapping in aluminium foil and placing in the cupboard to enrich for 2-3 days.
- 4. If desired, wrap a ribbon around the cake and tie in a bow to decorate. You could also cut stars out of fondant to place on top for decoration.







Lush gardens in the outback
