Local Government Elections October 2019

The bi-annual Local Government Elections are to be held on Saturday 19 October 2019.

This year the Shire of Laverton will have five vacant positions for nomination.

Four of the positions will be part of the natural rotation and each will be for a four year term (retiring 2023). The fifth position is the result of Councillor Rosemary Street's resignation and will be for a two year term (retiring 2021).

More information will be advertised and available as the election process eventually gains momentum, however in the meantime if anyone is interested in standing for Council and would like to discuss or seek some information please contact myself, Peter Naylor, Chief Executive Officer, at the Shire Administration Office on 9031 1202 or 0427 061 674.

Laverton Community Hub Projects

Works are now well advanced on this project.

It is expected the Hall will receive practical completion by the end of May.

The pool is also nearing completion but will most probably be towards the end of July due to a few hold ups in receiving bits and pieces from overseas.

Laverton Medical Practice

Council is pleased to advise that we have been successful in negotiating a new contractual arrangement with Pier Street Medical to provide ongoing medical services in Laverton for the next five years.

This is positive news for the provision of health services and provides Council and the community with some security in this important aspect of our lives.

Laverton Cemetery

Various works are continuing to provide a much needed facelift to the cemetery and for visitor access and comfort.

Works include new fencing, planting of vegetation along the fence line, new reticulation lines, car parking areas, gazebos and bench seating.

Airfield Apron Upgrade

Council has been successful in receiving grant funding that will mostly cover the works to increase the Airfield apron from two to four parking bays.

We are just completing survey, design and specifications and then will advertise the project for tender prior to the end of June.

It is expected that the apron works will be completed by the end of 2019.

As previously mentioned, it is anticipated that the expected increased activity through the Airfield will provide increased revenue to the Shire through the use of the Airfield and inject funds into the local economy.

Laverton Airfield Terminal

Due to the above and the expected increase in air traffic through the Airfield, Council recently advertised for expressions of interest from architectural companies to work with Council for the design of a new terminal.

Whilst this project is still a little while off it is part of our forward planning and hopefully will receive some traction in the not too distant future.

Windarra South Open Cut – Access

Poseidon Nickel have expressed concern in regards to safety, liability and legal access for persons using the Windarra South Open Cut for recreational activities.

The result of this is Poseidon Nickel will be installing a gate at the entrance to the access road off the Laverton-Leonora Road. Council appreciates that this is disappointing as it has been an area utilised by the local community for many years.

Council has commenced discussions with Poseidon Nickel to ascertain how we may be able to work together to open the area up as a legal recreation area but this may take some time, if indeed we are at all successful.

Mt Weld, Merolia (part) & Racecourse Roads Project

Works on this project are proceeding well. A large amount of rock caused a few issues in the first hill heading south, however we are now past this point and works should pick up schedule for completion by the end of 2019.

As previously mentioned there is a bypass road in place, along the former Focus Minerals haul road, please travel with care and following signs as appropriate.



High Level Water Tank

Seating has been placed at the foot of the water tank to enable community members and visitors alike to enjoy the serenity of the viewing point overlooking the town and surrounding areas.

Other works are planned, however we will try to align these with other works in town to save on mobilisation costs.

2017 & 2018 Flood Damage Works

Works are continuing on the Great Central, White Cliffs and Bandya Roads as part of the 2017 & 2018 WA Natural Disaster Relief & Recovery Arrangements funding program.

Solar Lighting to Footpath between Town and Wongatha Village

After a frustrated waiting period, the lights have finally arrived and are being installed for this project.

Main Roads WA – Notification of Roadworks

- Main Roads WA will be conducting works at various locations on the Goldfields Highway between October and December 2019. The works will include the repair of sealed pavement edges to restore line and level.
- Main Roads WA will be conducting works at various locations on Great Eastern Highway, Goldfields Highway, the Leonora-Laverton Road and the Mt Magnet-Leinster Road between July 2019 and June 2020. These works will include the slashing and spraying of vegetation within the road reserve.

'SOUTH WINDARRA MINE SITE'

It has come to our attention that the South Windarra open pit is being accessed by the general public for recreational and other activities. The South Windarra mining lease and the associated open pit is still an active mining lease and this access presents a potential safety issue to those who have not completed the necessary South Windarra safety training and Safety inductions as required under the Mining Act.

Due to the observed access of the area by the public and the risk of future public use we have had to physically close the site with gates and 'no entry' signage.

We are, however, currently working with the Shire of Laverton to find a way to make the South Windarra open pit lake available to the residents of Laverton, for public use in the future

Please be aware that, until the appropriate arrangements are in place with the Shire of Laverton to facilitate this benefit to the community, access to the South Windarra mining lease is prohibited. Other than authorised Poseidon personnel, people found to be accessing the South Windarra mining lease will be considered to be trespassing and Poseidon will seeking the assistance from the appropriate local authority to prohibit access.





At the age of sixteen Robin Scott came from Scotland with his parents to Western Australia, where he enrolled as an apprentice electrician. Immensely proud of his trade, Robin has worked for more than 30 years as an electrical contractor to the WA mining industry, especially in the Goldfields. Flying himself and his staff to electrical contracting assignments, Robin logged

4,000 hours in his Rockwell Commander, the aircraft he now uses to service his constituents in the vast Mining and Pastoral Region.

Robin is an enthusiastic campaigner for job opportunities through creating more apprenticeships for young men and young women. The Federal Government has partially embraced the Pauline Hanson's One Nation policy of subsidising apprentice wages 75% in the first year, 50% in the second year and 25% in the third year.

Robin Scott moved the Disallowance Motion which defeated the Government's attempt to increase the Gold Royalty by 50%. Robin is determined to protect and promote mining and led the defence against water charges for prospectors and small miners.

Robin's priorities for 2019 include:

- Water pipeline south from the Kimberley
- Sealing the Wiluna-Meekatharra Road
- · Insist on rapid delivery of the promised MRI machine for Kalgoorlie
- Big upgrade for palliative care for the Goldfields
- Aged care facility for Leonora
- New hospital for Laverton
- Push the Federal Govt to abolish Fringe Benefits Tax for remote area workers
- More jobs through quicker approvals for mines







CREAMY CHICKEN PASTA

Serves 4

Ingredients

- · 4 slices of bacon
- 2 chicken breasts
- Salt to taste
- Pepper to taste
- · 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- · 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 cups spinach (80 g)
- · 4 small tomatoes, diced
- 1 1/2 cups cream (360 ml)
- 1 cup (100 g) shredded parmesan cheese, plus more for serving
- 1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes, plus more to garnish
- · 285 g penne pasta cooked
- · chopped fresh parsley, for garnish

Method

- In a deep pan, fry the bacon until crispy. Remove to a paper towel to drain, then chop.
- In the same pan, add the chicken and season with salt, pepper,
 Italian seasoning and paprika. cook until no longer pink inside.
- · Add garlic and cook until softened.
- Add spinach and tomatoes, cook until spinach is wilted.
- Add the cream, Parmesan, and red pepper flakes then bring to a boil.
- Add the penne and bacon, stir until fully coated in sauce.
- · Serve with parsley, parmesan, and red pepper flakes if desired.

- Travelers to the Grand Canyon sometimes are not able to see across the Canyon because of air pollution that is produced from over 1000 miles away.




