Shire News

Community Bus

At the Ordinary Meeting of Council held on 28 March 2019, Council voted unanimously to waive the deposit and kilometre rate for the use of the Community Bus by Laverton Police to transport our junior footballers to and from Kalgoorlie to take part in the 2019 Junior Competition of the Goldfields Football League.

Airfield Apron Upgrade

We have lodged submissions to three grant programs for funding for an Airfield Apron Upgrade at Laverton. At the time this edition went to print, two of those submissions have been successful and it appears that this project will be able to progress. We are waiting for the results of the third submission and we will then be able to proceed with design and price information to enable us to call for tenders.

Great Central Road

The Deputy Prime Minister, the Hon. Mike McCormack, was in town this week to announce \$160 million in funding for the next 310km of sealing projects for the Outback Way. The Great Central Road is part of the Western Australian section of the road network which makes up the Outback Way of course, and our Shire President, Cr Patrick Hill, who is also the Chairman of the Outback Highway Development Council Inc., joined with other stakeholders from the Laverton community and local mining companies to welcome Minister McCormack to Laverton.

Cr Hill advised that a further 155km of the Great Central Road would be sealed with WA's allocation of \$95.5 million. Currently, preparation work is progressing to seal a section at the start of the Great Central Road from Laverton northwards.

Lancefield Diversion Road

Work will commence shortly on reconstructing a one kilometre section of the Lancefield Diversion Road at the Leonora-Laverton Road end. The Lancefield Diversion Road will be closed for all of April during these works and traffic for the Great Central Road, Bandy Road and Eristoun Road will be detoured via Sturt Pea Drive. Signage and traffic management will be in place.

Solar Lighting of Walkway between Town and the Wongatha Village

Unfortunately the contractor had a previous commitment for another contract and there has been a short delay in the installation of the solar lights, however they will be back in Laverton next week to pour the concrete footings for the lights and the lights themselves are expected to be installed and running during the following week.

Main Street Lighting

The Main Street lights have not been working for some time, mainly due to vandalism, but we are getting quotes to repair/replace the lights as necessary and hope to have them working again as soon as possible.

Laverton Cemetery Works

Following Council's endorsement of the Master Plan for the Laverton Cemetery as recommended by the Friends of Laverton Cemetery Advisory Group at the February Ordinary Meeting of Council, the Town Crew have been continuing with fencing, garden planting and reticulation works at the Cemetery.

SEALING AUSTRALIA'S 'LONGEST SHORT-CUT' - A NATIONAL VISION

Today in Laverton WA- Hon. Mike McCormack- Deputy Prime Minister, Minister for Infrastructure announced the next 310km of sealing projects for the Outback Way, the 2,720 kilometres highway from Laverton, Western Australia to Winton, Queensland- linking Perth to Cairns.

These projects are priorities within the Outback Way Investment Strategy and are funded by the \$160Million announced in the 2018 Budget." said Mr Patrick Hill – Chairman Outback Highway Development Council Inc. (OHDC Inc) .

"The OHDC Inc welcomes the \$330million investment from the Australian Government to date for the Outback Way and acknowledged the additional 20% contribution and works done by WA, Qld & NT governments, taking the total investment to \$400million since 2014" Mr Hill said.

"From the combined funding- Western Australian section of the route would receive a further \$95.5 million and seal 155km, the Northern Territory section receiving a further \$62.5 million and seal 97.25km and the Queensland section a further \$42million and seal 58.7km - in total 310.95km will be sealed or widened." Mr Hill said.

Outback Highway Development Council Chairman Patrick Hill said "the investment will improve the standard of the road reduce travel times, cut freight costs and closures for critical regional industries such as mining, Ag and tourism, and improve road safety across the route."

"The sealing of the Outback Way improves community access, supports economic development across the region and more reliable access to health and education services for remote indigenous communities," Mr Hill said.

"This is an essential project for Australia with these rolling projects and funding - this trans-national project is becoming a reality." Mr Hill said.

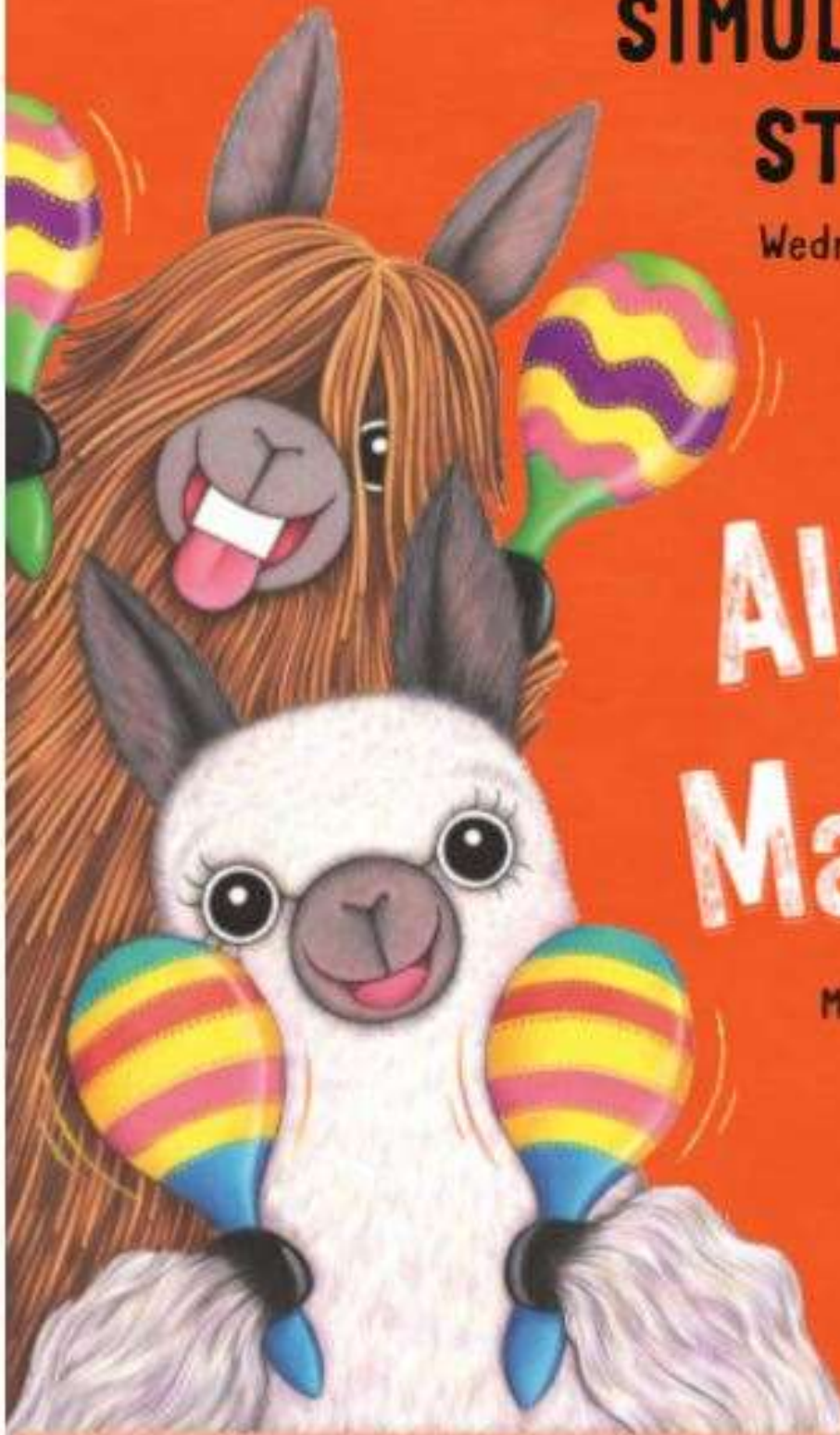

TADPOLES --> FROGS



TADPOLES

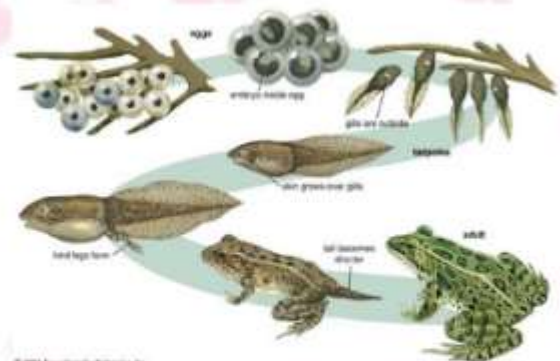
As part of the Laverton Community Resource Centres Story and Rhyme Time programme, the Laverton CRC has been growing and watching Tadpoles turn into Frogs. This process has lasted a whole month, and each Wednesday the children have watched the Tadpoles metamorph right before their eyes, developing back legs, front legs and watching their tail shrink as they become frogs.

METAMORPHOSIS

Pictured to the left is the stages our tadpoles have gone through in the past month. Metamorphosis is a process of rapid and extreme body changes to an organism when they are maturing / becoming an adult, typically consuming completely different resources to that of their adult form. Tadpoles go through drastic changes, while they are born without legs, live in the water, eat algae and plants, they change into frogs which live on land, breathe air and eat insects.

DID YOU KNOW?

It is thought that almost 2/3 of species alive today use metamorphosis to accomplish large changes between their adult and juvenile form.

Zucchini and ricotta tarts

- 4 Sheets of filo pastry
- Olive oil spray
- 2 medium zucchini, trimmed
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 1/2 cups low fat ricotta
- 2 eggs, whisked
- 1/2 cup dill sprigs, finely chopped
- Extra dill to serve
- 1 lemon, finely grated
- Lemon wedges to serve
- 2 tbs finely grated parmesan

Step 1: Pre-heat oven to 180°. Grease 4 metal pie tins. Lay 1 sheet of filo pastry on the bench. Spray both sides with olive oil. Cut pastry in half to make 2 square pieces. Cut each piece into 4 equal squares and stack them on top of each other, angling alternate pieces to make a flower like shape. Press into pie tin, repeat with remaining filo sheets.

Step 2: Grate zucchini and place into a colander. Sprinkle over salt. Stand for 10 minutes. Squeeze as much liquid as possible from the zucchini and place into a large mixing bowl.

Step 3: Add ricotta, eggs, dill and lemon rind. Spoon into pastry shells. Place tarts onto a tray. Sprinkle over parmesan. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until pastry is golden brown and filling is set. Serve with extra dill and lemon. Enjoy

CONTAINING PRICKLES IN THE GARDEN



By Jaclyn Jones

I think i can speak for all of us when i say that prickles aren't a fun weed to have in the garden! Especially at this time of year, we will all notice an influx of the dreaded prickles, Doublegee and Caltrop. Although there is no way to get rid of them permanently, here are some tips on keeping them contained along with some interesting facts.

Caltrop:

- The fruit are segmented with up to five parts spread along the stem at short intervals, so even a small plant may produce hundreds of seeds.
- Spraying them with Glyphosate, or more commonly known as round up, will kill the plant, but not the seeds, which remain viable for up to seven years.
- The best way of removal, is to physically remove the plant when it first starts to show along with most of the seeds with it.

Double Gee's

- Double Gees or Three Corner Jack is a vigorous weed with a strong tap root and a long fleshy, hairless stem.
- Round Ribbed stems branching from the centre of the rosette may grow up to 600mm in length. Clusters of very small, inconspicuous white flowers produce hard woody achenes with three sharp spines radiating from the apex.
- This weed can contaminate grain, leading to a rejection of grain deliveries.
- Double Gee's can cause health problems for animals.
- It has also evolved a resistance to herbicides. Best way to keep this unwanted weed at bay is to pull out weed, including all roots and seeds when it first starts to grow.

It was a short and fruitful trip for me and I will be back again soon in town.


















