However there may be a change to this as the State Government has recently passed amendments to the Local Government providing the Minister for Local Government with powers to amend certain provisions within the Act specifically in response to the COVID-19 Emergency, and this includes suspending the need to hold public meetings.

We should know more about this following the expected issue of a State Government Order in the next week. Should this occur Council has directed that the 2018/2019 Annual Report be displayed on the Shire Website inviting public comments and questions for a period of 28 days.

### Council Works and Services

# Laverton/Leonora COVID-19 Crisis schedule



#### Financial relief for renters

If you're a tenant who's lost their job in the coronavirus crunch, you may be wondering how to afford what's likely the household's biggest weekly expense - the rent.

To relieve some of the burden, the State Government has announced a \$30 million residential rental relief scheme, which will see payments of up to \$2000 granted to landlords on behalf of tenants in financial strife due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tenants can apply for the grant online, however there are some things they should know before taking that step.

To qualify you must be in 'financial hardship', meaning you've lost your job on or after March 20 due to COVID-19, have applied for, or are now receiving. Centrelink income support, plus your household must have less than \$10,000 in savings and be spending at least 25 per cent of its available after-tax income on rent.

You must have agreed to a reduction in rent with your landlord or engaged in Consumer Protection's conciliation service.

A tenancy bond would have been – or shortly will be – lodged with the Bond Administrator, and you must live in either a private residential property, rooming house or residential park.

Documentary evidence showing you meet the above criteria is required, as well as proof of citizenship, residency or an appropriate visa.

It's important to remember that the grant must be applied for by the tenant, but will be paid directly to the landlord. Neither party will need to repay the grant, however the landlord needs to ensure the lower rent is payable for the minimum period or that the amount of the grant offsets any deferred rental debt. It is important that the tenant receives the benefits of the grant along with the landlord.

The scheme is due to expire on 29 September 2020, however it's worth knowing that the total available for all grants is \$30 million, meaning this may limit the time that applications can be made.





# A Message from the Catholic Parish of Church of the Resurrection, Laverton





# Hello All Readers and the Laverton Community

Coronavirus (COVID-19) is certainly becoming a well-known term used in our everyday lives. The whole world is affected by this unprecedented pandemic. We've heard and seen reports, articles, news clips, social media posts and of course spoken to



people, all telling us to social distance, wash our hands and to stay at home.

On March 15 the Western Australia government declared a state of emergency as the number of COVID-19 cases in Australia reached 300. Over the course of the following weeks the number of confirmed cases rose rapidly as federal, state and local governments along with health officials and police worked closely together to implement strategies to protect all Australians.

In Western Australia we have seen our state borders shut and the state divided up into 9 regions, where travel between the regions is restricted to persons only with exemptions. These tight restrictions have been imposed to minimise the spread of the virus. If you would like to know more information about the exemptions or wish to apply for an exemption please go to <a href="https://www.wa.gov.au">www.wa.gov.au</a>

The government has also imposed tighter restrictions in areas determined as Bio-Security Zones which include parts of the East Pilbara and Kimberley regions and the Shire of Ngaanyatjarraku.

As of Tuesday March 24, Laverton Police have maintained a Vehicle Check Point (VCP) on the Great Central Road cross of the Lancefield Diversion Road, Laverton. This VCP is manned 24/7 where our role is to help protect the Western Australian border along with the Shire of Ngaanyatjarraku and of course the Shire of Laverton.

We are stopping all vehicles, obtaining all passenger details and determining the purpose of their journey. As the restrictions tightened we are now recording the movements of vehicular traffic to and from the Bio-Security Zone with an online app, G2G PASS. Under legislation, including the Biosecurity Determination 2020 and the Emergency Management Act 2005 we are restricting the movements of non-exempt persons and ordering those required, to self-quarantine.



So, what does this mean for the people in our community?

The state government urges people to stay at home except when carrying out essential activities which include:

- Shopping for what you need food, takeaway, and necessary supplies
- Medical or health care need, including compassionate requirements
- Exercise in compliance with the public gathering requirements
- Work or study if you can't work or learn from home

# May police report





The Cosmo-Newberry Community, although does not fall in the Bio-Security Zone, is however affected by the Remote Aboriginal Communities Directions. It's important for those community members to be aware that we will not restrict the movements between the community and the town of Laverton for those travelling for the purpose of obtaining essential goods and services such as medical and food supplies.

We receive information almost daily that people are deliberately avoiding the VCP for various reasons and I would suggest it's because people are either unsure if they can travel to Laverton from communities or they are doing what they shouldn't be. This is a timely reminder that one of our primary roles as police officers is to keep all community members safe. The use of back tracks, allowing unlicensed vehicles and driver's, permitting persons affected by intoxicants such as drugs (prescribed or illicit), alcohol or solvents to drive, only increase the risk of the occupants in those vehicles, being seriously or even fatally injured.

Laverton police are still attending residences where there are large numbers of people present and clearly not practising social distancing requirements. The state government has legislated \$1,000 on the spot fines for those breaching public gathering and social distancing requirements. There are so many people already suffering a financial detriment at this time and we don't want to place more financial pressure on individuals however we do have a role to play and that is to keep everyone safe. We have cautioned a number of persons so far and on the spot fines will be considered if poor and unsafe practices continue.

It's not only the role of the police and key stakeholders in town to keep the community members safe, it's the responsibility of EVERY community member. We need to be united as one, we all need to band together to teach and encourage every one of us to do the right thing.

Finally, I want to finish off by saying, I certainly understand it may be difficult for our children and youth to grasp the complexities of the current situation. All youth activities and planned events have been postponed which I know can create boredom. As parents and responsible adults for our youth it's imperative we speak to them and implement strategies and planned activities in the home environment to keep our children occupied. It's also important to discuss the impacts and consequences of any bad behaviours. We have noticed an increase in offences being committed in the community by a number of our young people. This comes at a cost, both financially for the community and through the use of police resources. These resources that can be better used protecting the community in the fight to prevent the Coronavirus coming to Laverton. So please engage with your children and encourage them to stay home unless attending school.

United we will stand as one community and we will be hard to defeat.
