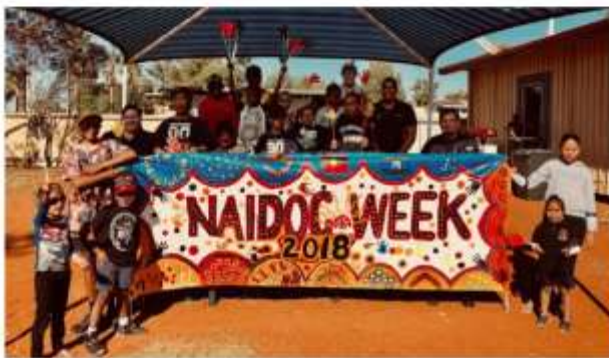

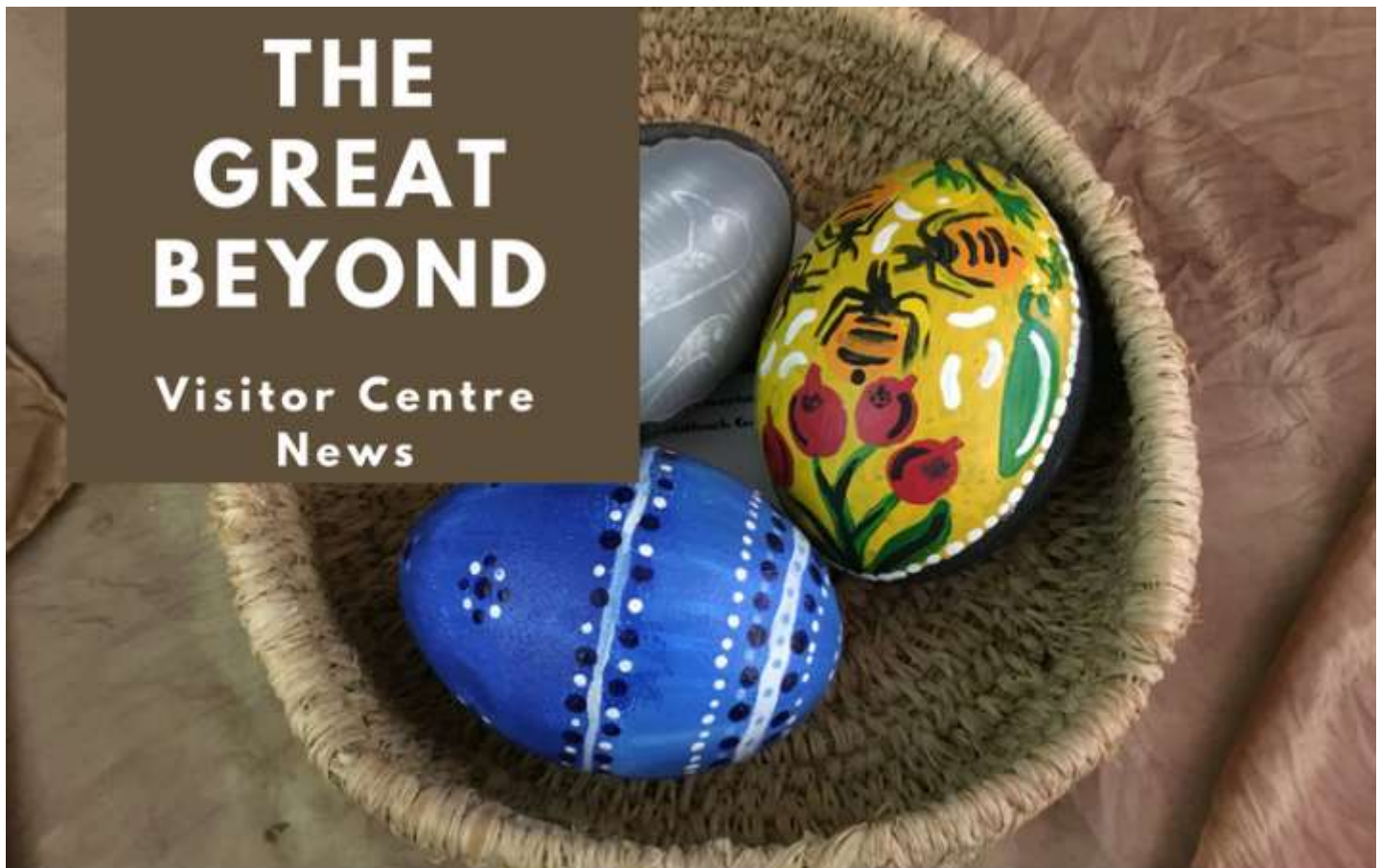

The Minara Community Foundation 2018 grant applications process is now open.

Local community and interest groups have until 5:00pm Friday 10 August 2018 to apply for funding.

Consideration will be given to a wide range of projects to build community capacity in one or more of the following areas in the Shires of Laverton, Leonora and Menzies:

- Education, including training and education opportunities;
- Health and other social benefits;
- Economic development;
- Environment;
- Programs and initiatives for youth and future generations; and
- Culture and heritage, including the protection of Indigenous culture.

Ideally, grant projects should occur or commence by 31 March 2019.

Grant applications of up to \$100,000 are invited for consideration. Smaller projects are also encouraged to apply (e.g. \$1,000 to \$10,000).

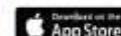

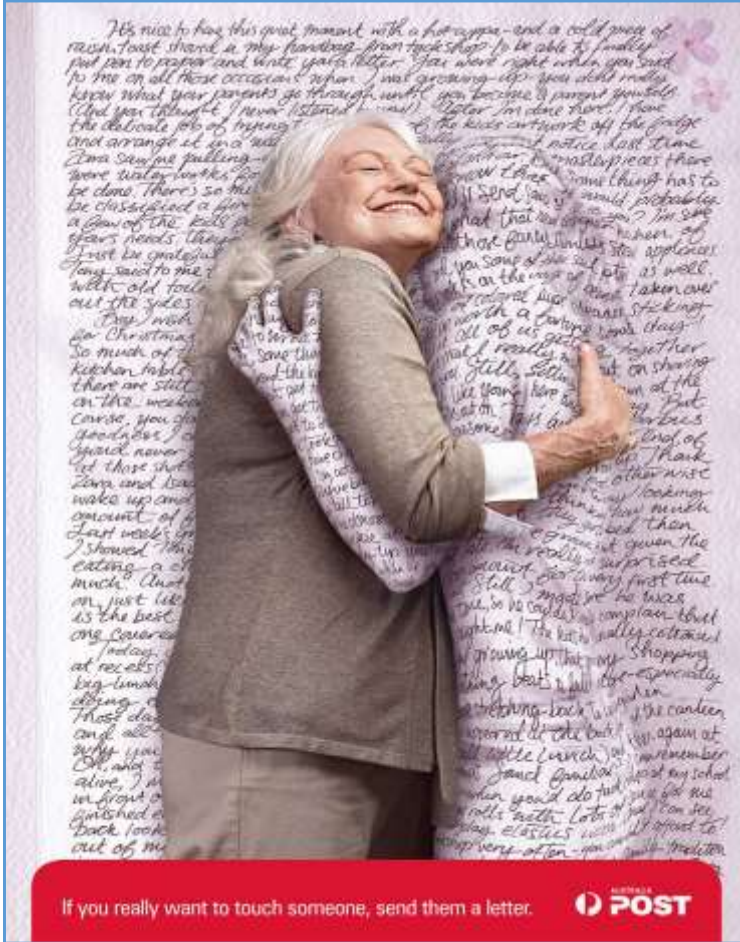

- 4) And some glow in the dark paint!



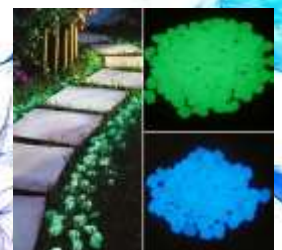
Steps:

COSMETIC TESTING ON ANIMALS

Every morning I sit in front of the mirror to get ready for the day. As I sit there, applying makeup, I often wonder where else has this been before me? The shops? The factory? Most of the time we don't ever think about these products being used on anything else but ourselves, but there is definitely something more sinister behind the scenes. Animals all over the world are subjected to abuse every single day just so we can wear makeup, so we can smell nice, so we can stay clean. It does not have to be this way, but it still happens to this day, in 2018!



TESTING:

An estimated 27,000 animals are still being subjected to cosmetic testing around the world, which involves the testing of nail polishes, makeup, soaps, moisturizers and chemicals that go inside these products. This involves testing on Rabbits, Mice, Rats, Hamsters and Guinea pigs, Fish and many more animals.

INFORMATION:

- Animals are completely different to humans, meaning they make very poor test subjects. 94% of tests that pass on animals, will fail human clinical trials.
- 95% of animals are not covered in the Animal Welfare Association (rats, fish, mice, birds). The Animal Welfare Association protected 20,812 animals in 2016, leaving 25 million animals not protected - which often means these animals are poorly treated.
- 50% of animals end up dying every year through cosmetic testing
- The Humane Society estimates that around 100,000 - 200,000 animals are used in experiments annually. (http://www.hsi.org/issues/becrueltyfree/facts/about_cosmetics_animal_testing.html)

WHAT TO DO:

- Stop buying from the companies that test on animals, the smallest changes can make the biggest difference if everyone gets involved. If profits start going down it could make these companies reconsider, and go cruelty free!
